


Birmingham and Solihull Mental Health Trust Governance Structures 2019/20




**Integrated Quality Committee:** The primary purpose of the committee is to ensure, on behalf of the Board that the Trust is aiming to achieve the highest standards of quality around safety, patient experience and clinical effectiveness, as outlined in the Well Led Framework, the Quality Strategy and Quality Accounts. The committee will monitor progress against implementation of these key documents and will provide assurance to the Trust Board on the effectiveness of the quality and safety of services, to ensure that there is no negative impact on quality due to financial decision making; and to ensure regulatory compliance in respect of quality.

**Trust Clinical Governance Committee:** to oversee the operation of clinical governance across the Trust. Specifically this will include ensuring that there is a systematic and co-ordinated approach to the provision of good quality clinical care across all areas of the Trust. Continuous improvement of clinical services and patient safety and risks are effectively assessed, revised and managed
