What is:

(a) your overall spend on private inpatient beds in each of the last 10 years;

Please note:

- BSMHFT have been responsible for the funding of private inpatient beds for the last 4 years and therefore, do not have data covering the requested time period.
- For the financial year 2023/24 the Trust is unable to provide the actual spend and can only share the forecast position until year end is finalised.
- Below figures includes both Spot and Block purchased beds for each of the financial years.
