There is an ongoing procurement process to replace the Crisis House which closed last year September.

The new provision will be called a Recovery House- an engagement day has been held but the process is still ongoing.

2. Do you provide accommodation for clients who require somewhere to stay short term?

We have a respite provision but this is more focused on step down rather than crisis, and they are for a limited period.

3. How many clients were in a crisis as a result of bereavement from suicide in the last year?

The Trust is unable to provide a response to this query.

Although we can identify a crisis referral, we are unable to identify if they were due to bereavement from suicide.
